

Title I Program

What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federal aid program for our nation's schools. Every year each state receives a grant for the program. The state then sends the money to school districts based on the number of low income families.

What is the purpose of Title I schools?

Title I provides additional funding so that all children can obtain a high quality education.

- Title I funds provide extra supports and interventions for struggling students.
- Children attending a school-wide Title I school are eligible for funding supports regardless of family income.

Which schools in our district receive Title I funds?

Title I funding is provided at our four elementary schools. (Belton Elementary School, Marshall Primary School, Honea Path Elementary School and Wright Elementary School)

What does Title I pay for?

Title I supplements but does not replace funding already provided for the school. Title I provides an additional layer of academic supports.

Funding is used for:

- Parent Involvement Activities such as Family Nights and Parent Newsletters
- Professional Development (Attending conferences or workshops to learn additional research-based teaching strategies and program applications)
- Supporting Emergency Medical or Supply Needs for At-Risk or Homeless Students
- Class-size Reduction/Intervention Support
- Materials and Supplies to Support Student Interventions
- Program Administrative Costs
